


• Simulacrum: a representation or imitation of something; a copy

1st order: an original that is a copy (less real than what it represents)

2nd order: a copy of an original (as real as what it represents)

3rd order: a copy without an original (

- More real than the reality it claims to represent
- Once frozen in time, the photographs suddenly come alive and the individuals they portray can blink, move their heads from side to side, and smile
- The effect is mesmerizing and at the same time eerie we don't expect the past to be re-animated
- The element of wonder is replaced by a sense of unease as we realize that the movements, we are witnessing are computer-generated a phenomenon known as the uncanny valley

- Saw the camera's lens as a tool to help free Black people step into a new identity
- For many, his portraits were the blueprint of Black freedom and dignity
- Through the eye of the camera, he could control how he was seen
- In images of him, his face is always stern & unflinching
- He never smiled in photographs
